It appears certain that the Pennoyer staff members heard about this program as they were the school we partnered with last year in providing them needed supplies. It makes me proud to see the effort retired educators put in to supporting ongoing educational programs.

In October WLSU will be sending a contingent of just under 20 members to the IRTA convention in Springfield. This convention is held every other year, and it is a good opportunity to learn about the organization and hear information that impacts us as retired educators. Membership Report

IRTA State membership as of October 14, 2019, was 38,807, the highest number in association history. Between September 9, 2018, and September 9, 2017, there was a 3,144 member increase. In that same time frame—2018 to 2019, IRTA gained 3,090 new members. We do continue to enroll new members. Not all new members are



new retirees. Associate Life membership has increased to 535 since the *Action* article by Mike Schmidt. The committee had set a goal of bringing a net 1,500 increase in membership, but gaining membership is still a challenge though we are doing better than many other organizations. We lose approximately 800-900 members each year due to death. There are 107 state Pipeline members. IRTA is suggesting these members could provide names and email information of other pipeline workers.

Nathan Mihelich is putting together an email campaign to all non-members identifying the Arizona crisis and encouraging membership in IRTA to these retirees and reminding them that IRTA works on their behalf, so this doesn't happen in Illinois.



Foundation News

This Fall, the Illinois Retired Teachers Association (IRTAF) has awarded \$36,500 in grant money to 77 active public school educators from across the state. There were 390 applicants. Of the 75 grants awarded, 11 were granted to teachers in Area 3 and three were made to educators in the WLSU school districts.

This grant money will allow these educators to enrich their instruction with materials not otherwise available to them. Their students are the real winners! A special thank you to the Illinois Principals Association for their assistance with the promotion of this program. Below, you will find the name of each winner listed, along with his/her school, IRTA Area, and a paragraph summary about each project in the winner's own words.

REAL ID goes into effect October 1, 2020. Your current Illinois Driver's license/ID will be accepted until October 1, 2020, for domestic flights, entry

to military bases, and entry to secure federal facilities. Starting October 1, 2020, in order to be compliant with TSA regulations, you will need a REAL ID. To get a REAL ID you will need to go to an Illinois Secretary of State Drivers facility. You will need to show proof

of your identity, residency, Social Security status, and legal presence in the U.S.

The REAL ID website has all the information you need to prepare for your visit, including an interactive checklist to help you gather the documents you will need. The website

is realid.ilsos.gov

Printed information about REAL ID is available at Drivers facilities, libraries, and state government offices. Check

the www.wlsu.weebly.com under Related Articles and Videos for a full explanation of what you need to bring to the DMV to get your new license.

Remember, you have until October 1, 2020, to take care of this, but don't wait until the last minute!

Note: Your valid passport may be used for identification on domestic flights and is required for international flights.

Legislative Update

The Governor signed HB 2700 on August 23, 2019, making the legislation Public Act 101-483. The legislation increased the time period that an individual may receive a refund of an overpayment to TRIP or TRAIL to 7 years. The legislation passed the House unanimously and was forwarded to the Senate where it was also passed unanimously. IRTA will continue to work with CMS to make sure that the legislation is implemented correctly and eligible individual are able to receive their full refunds. Currently the law does not go into effect until January 2020 and is not retroactive. IRTA is talking to the Governor's office, and might be adding a trailer bill onto this legislation in the Fall Veto session to make it retroactive. The Legal Defense Fund currently is \$147,972,88.

Total Retiree Advantage Illinois

If you are enrolled in TRAIL for your health insurance, here is an exciting new benefit. Beginning January 1, 2020, you can get \$2500 per ear toward hearing aids. All that is required is an exam from a licensed audiologist. Watch for more information from TRAIL about this benefit.

Please Notice: **Membership Renewal**

October began our annual renewal process. Only members who owe WLSU dues and pay on an annual basis will have received a renewal letter the first week of October. This letter contained a form explaining exactly what is owed and how to proceed. The mailing label on this newsletter will show your current dues status. A '19 behind IRTA and/or WLSU indicates that dues are owed for next year. You can pay your dues by mailing a check made out to WLSU to Louise Sterett, 770 57th St., #2, Clarendon Hills, Il 60514. Make the check out for \$30 for 3 years, \$45 for 5 years, or \$125 for life. Those owing IRTA dues will have received a separate letter from IRTA in late October. The keynote speaker was Chief Justice Lloyd Karmeier. "Crisis is not the time to abandon the rule of law; it is a time to defend it." These were the words of the Chief Justice in defending our constitutional rights to our promised pension when writing the



Illinois Supreme Court's position despite the dire economic problems of our state. These words

echoed in our memories and our hearts as the Honorable Justice addressed the opening session of the IRTA representative assembly, said Mary Richie. Karmeier went on to say we must enable the government to control the governed, but

we must be sure the government controls itself



Next we saw a video address by Governor JB Pritzker in which he acknowledged the importance of education and the contributions made by educators.

After the opening of the General Assembly, Reports and Procedures, Breakout Sessions, and Caucuses to discuss the proposed constitutional amendments, delegates enjoyed a


banquet at which Unit Honorees were announce and
